Question #1 Operational Referendum

Authorization to exceed the revenue limit by **\$675,000** for the next three years in order to maintain the current level of educational programming and to operate the district

- Why?**
- Wisconsin funding for public schools has negatively impacted Randall School. Wisconsin Revenue Caps has capped spending per student \$1,100 below the state average. This represents a \$600,000 revenue shortfall for Randall School.
 - Randall School District has seen a significant drop in school aid since 2008-09. The amount has been reduced by \$1,051,823 which totals a near 43% reduction in state aid to the district in the last ten years.
 - Maintain lower class sizes that support academic and emotional growth
 - To maintain the excellence that Randall School has come to expect for its students
 - Continue to enhance innovative programs and extra-curricular opportunities
 - Retain and recruit outstanding staff



Question #2 Facility Referendum

Authorization not to exceed **\$5.5M** to make improvements to the district facilities including safety and security upgrades, additions and renovations of classrooms and cafeteria, capital improvements, remodeling and repairs, and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment

- Why?**
- Security improvements to both entrances will continue to keep our students and staff safe
 - Cafeteria space is outdated and too small for the existing student enrollment
 - Additional classrooms will enhance student learning and provide flexibility for future growth
 - Deferred maintenance items include replacement of elementary roof that is past its life expectancy, outdated flooring and cabinets, and upgrades to building mechanicals

What is the Tax Impact?

A successful operational and facility referendum will increase taxes on a two hundred thousand dollar home by \$88 next year or \$7.33 per month and then remain flat with no additional increases in subsequent years.
